Educational Programs to accompany Making Her Mark: Women Artists of the Providence Art Club, 1880

Daily Dialogues

For too long women artists have been evaluated not on the work of arts they created, but rather by their gender, their friends and where they fit into the art historical canons of the moment. *Making Her Mark: Women Artists of the Providence Art Club, 1880* is an exhibition that presents a selection of Providence Art Club female founding members and exhibitors from the perspective of art professionals, makers and educators.

To maximize the visitors experience to the exhibition, the Providence Art Club has asked a wide range of community art experts and art enthusiasts to pick one work of art on exhibit daily and "dialogue" on only that one work. This idea was inspired by the "Slow Art Movement" and studies from the Metropolitan Museum of Art where visitors spent an average of 17 seconds gazing at a single artwork in the museum and the Louvre where even the *Mona Lisa* only secured a 15-second glance, "Daily Dialogues" will provide insight into one work of art in the *Making Her Mark: Women Artists of the Providence Art Club, 1880* exhibition.

You can sign up for a 30-minute "Daily Dialogue" slot with a 15-minute insight by a speaker, dialogue and visit to the exhibition.
