

Behind the Brush: *Tom Monahan on Teaching*

For this month's edition of '**Behind the Brush**', Education Coordinator Maya Stern sat down with **Instructor Tom Monahan** to discuss his creative background and how it relates to teaching. Tom believes teaching painting and his long career of creative directing in advertising are quite similar, the most important element being an environment that encourages and inspires.

Tom's creative journey started with a career in advertising first as a writer, then a founding partner at ad agency *Leonard/Monahan/ Saabye* in 1978. Tom managed the writers and artists to develop attention-getting, unique creative work for an array of clients; *Gerber, Keds, Polaroid,* among others. As CD, Tom didn't dictate or "veto" much, but instead worked to maintain a thriving creative environment. In no time, word of this creative hothouse quickly spread nationally, and soon people were coming to LMS from far and wide, knowing they'd have the opportunity to become the best versions of themselves.

In the late '80s, Tom became an adjunct professor of advertising at **Boston University** part time, and discovered a passion for teaching. He went on to teach classes for the **Boston Ad Club**, then other creative professional organizations throughout the US. This ultimately led to his second career as a Creativity Coach, sending him around the globe to help artists and business people improve their creativeness.

As he started contemplating retirement, Tom's wife, Audrey, already an Exhibiting Artist member of the **Providence Art Club**, suggested he take a painting class here. He immediately fell in love with painting and our Club. A year and a half later, Tom became an Exhibiting Artist member.

After years of taking classes and painting hundreds of works of art, Tom's desire to help others grow artistically reignited. He has been conducting classes at our Club since 2018. Currently teaching regularly, Tom uses an individualized approach with each student, to help them identify and meet their aspirations and goals. At the start of a term, students identify their objectives for the next 10 weeks, then Tom uses their desires and his expertise as a roadmap for their artistic growth, a process this enthusiastic teacher relishes.

She has received numerous awards for her work as well. 
