FIRESIDE HISTORY WITH DAN MECHNIG

This month, past-president Dan Mechniq shared with us the history behind our beloved Providence Art Club Seal. Designed by John Howard Benson, the seal we know and love connects back to the initial heraldic concept that was once used for the seal for the Town (now city) of Providence. Consisting of six six-pointed stars surrounding a star with twelve points, that seal has since been abandoned by the city, with traces of it only remaining on the flag of Providence's City Council. While the confirmed origin story has been lost to the sands of time, it has been speculated that the design for the seal of Providence was based off of the heavens themselves; with the central star or sun passing its power and light to the lesser bodies that orbit it.

This story, when applied to the same figure as art, resonated greatly with John Howard Benson and his hopes for the future that our Club would bring. In his version, Benson saw the central,

flaming star as the creative inspiration and spirit that burns inside the soul of artists everywhere. Combining this with the surrounding stars intended to symbolize the central star shedding its life force on the arts, with the encircling stars drawing their strength and being from the energies of that central power source. Thinking in terms of the arts and creativity, Benson felt that no symbol would be more appropriate than the expression of a life force that stimulates and inspires its surroundings, just as the Providence Art Club was founded to do in our beloved Renaissance City.



A Plan for the Future

In September 2022, the Board of Managers of the Providence Art Club unanimously voted to seek professional assistance to guide in strategic planning for the future. This strategic plan will establish priorities and identify key initiatives while providing framework for making future decisions efficiently. The Board looks forward to engaging the membership in the process, so that a solid model will reflect the wishes and aspirations of the Art Club as a whole.

I loved the functionality within all their works. Dr. Gruppuso working primarily with wood in an innovative and unique way, creating clocks, boxes, and other functional furniture. Mr. Read's glass pieces truly stood out with his creative use of color and shape. Mrs. Labrie's one-of-a-kind jewelry incorporated such timeless and unique qualities that drew out our emotions. I also really enjoyed 2D works by Sam Green and Karole Nicholson. The use of Mr. Green's hues and shapes, and his unconventional way of painting landscapes is truly like no other. While Ms. Nicholson's collage and mixed media work crosses a path between abstract and contemporary landscape.

Although this was my first Little Pictures, it was truly an experience to remember. A moment where we all came together to create something big; a time of giving back and creating. Until next year!

Behind the Brush:

Kirsten Sorensen on Arts Education

For this month's "Behind the Brush", Education Coordinator, Maya Stern, sat down with instructor Kirsten Sorensen to discuss her extensive background in education. Kirsten is an advocate of self-expression through arts-based research and experimentation.


Kirsten's career in education began the summer before she went to college, working as a teacher's assistant to an elementary art teacher. She received her Bachelor of Fine Arts in Arts Education and Painting from Drake University in Des Moines, Iowa. Upon graduating, she moved to Chicago, Illinois, where she accepted a position at the Winnetka Community House as an Early Childhood Supervisor before being promoted to the Director in 1977.

After moving to Rhode Island, Kirsten became a long-term substitute teacher of Art at the Veterans School in Central Falls, where she created programming that visually communicated lessons to students who could not speak English. This sparked a passion which Kirsten describes as "trying to understand how everyone learns". She made it a goal to reach the needs of every student, despite their learning styles or ... challenges.

She was awarded a position of Secondary Art Teacher at Cranston High School East in 1995. She stressed the significance of teaching proper technique to students, stating "it is hard enough to create art when you don't know how to create it". She encouraged her students to learn how to observe and appreciate the world around them.

Kirsten began experimenting with printmaking as a method of replicating painting. Soon after joining the Providence Art Club, she was recommended to teach a course on Monotype. She enjoys employing technique while allowing room for experimentation.

Kirsten will be teaching Mixed Media Printmaking, Beginner and Beyond on Wednesdays from 9:30am – 12:30pm, from January 25 – March 29 in the Garden Level Printmaking Studio.

New Year, New Course Catalog

Read about some of the newest course offerings for the Winter 2023 class term. Maybe you'll find something new!

Adding Detail to Your Paintings with Watercolor with Gina Croce

Mar. 6 - Apr. 10 | Mondays, 1-4pm

In this class, you will learn how to add detail to your watercolor paintings while adding color harmony-creating interesting compositions and dynamics to your work. We will focus on clean lines, interesting shadows, and clean colors. This class is suitable for beginners to advanced watercolorists who want to learn techniques to bring their watercolor skill to the next level.

Photography for Painters with Gershon Stark

Feb. 28 - Mar. 28 | Tuesdays, 9am-12pm

This course aims to teach students an approach to photography that will enable them to create better reference shots for their paintings. The photographic tools of framing, depth of field, perspective, and juxtaposition will be used to help students view subjects more creatively. Students will practice ways of looking, moving, and framing that even without a reference photo will create the potential for a better painting, in studio or plein air.

Group Portraiture with Agustín Patiño

Jan. 29 - Apr. 2 | Sundays, 12-2pm

In this course, students will learn new techniques for creating advanced portraiture and contemporary figurative art with several subjects; such as how to create a dynamic composition, and how to use perspective to showcase harmony among the group while also showcasing every individual. Students will work with a variety of models in varying quantities throughout the course.





On Thursday, December 15th, Charles Wharton led his pop-up workshop, "The Art of Entertainment". Participants were introduced to methods of hosting parties and events before tasting an array of appetizer samples and cocktail specials.
