Pushing Your Limits in Watercolor with Bill Lane & Anne P. Wert

Description:

During the Winter session, Anne and Bill will split the 8-week session: 4 weeks of Bill teaching and 4 weeks of Anne teaching the class. We'll explore different watercolor techniques, through exercises and/or demos, fine-tuning your value studies and planning your composition before you start painting. This will help ensure you start with a successful design...and painting! (Solid planning, a value sketch and drawing skills will make your watercolor painting a bit easier.) We just ask that you have, at least, tried watercolor a little before taking this class. Paint from your own images or set up a still life but make sure you are passionate about your subject. It will show in your work!

Bill Lane Bio:

At age 7, Bill started drawing with Liz Harvey in what was then, the Newport Art Association. Later in life, he started watercolor painting at the Attleboro Arts Museum in the early 90's. However, running his own graphic design studio pulled him in lots of different directions, mostly away from painting as dictated by his 'paying' clients. Bill is an Exhibiting Artist Member of the Providence Art Club as well as a Signature Artist Member in the New England Watercolor Society and the Rhode Island Watercolor Society and an artist member of the Copley Society of Art in Boston.

Anne P. Wert Bio:

Anne P. Wert is an artist and educator. After a career as an elementary school teacher, Anne spent many years living and painting overseas in Europe and Asia before eventually moving with her family to Rhode Island. Her background is in oils, but she is also captivated by the immediacy and unpredictability of watercolors. She mostly works from her home studio, but still enjoys plein air painting when possible. Anne teaches painting at several locations in Rhode Island.

Explore ways to enrich and expand your printmaking experience with relief techniques in which you enjoy working. Use monotype techniques, linocut, collagraph as you wish with personalized instruction. Use the printing press and/or try methods of hand printing. Caligo Safe Wash Inks are available for the class and there is some free light-weight Japanese printing paper available also.

In this class we will go over different types of still life paintings and explore in detail what it takes to make your still life paintings more compelling. This course is open to representational painters working in any medium.

Marine Botanical Seaweed Pressing and Collage with Mary Jameson

Description:

In this 5-week course artist Mary Chatowsky Jameson, owner of Saltwater Studio Newport Art & Design, will introduce seaweed as a medium in art making. Participants will create seaweed pressings using local specimens and learn techniques in collaging dry and wet seaweed. Pressings made in the first class will be worked on throughout the next classes to create layered designs. The seaweed pressing kits, which are like flower presses but adapted for working with this wet medium, are reusable and constructed mostly from recycled materials. You will learn about the history of seaweed as an art form and its ties to the New England coast.

Mary Jameson Bio:

Mary is the owner of Saltwater Studio Art & Design in Newport, Rhode Island. She received her BFA in Graphic Design and Illustration from the University of Miami and has certificates in Museum Studies from Tufts University and Appraisal Studies in Art & Antiques from RISD/ American Society of Appraisers. In 2011 she began exploring seaweed as a medium in her art practice and had her first solo museum show at the Newport Art Museum in 2014. She currently has a piece in the New Bedford Whaling Museum's exhibit: The Cultures of Seaweed, A Singularly Marine and Fabulous Produce, June 5 – December 3, 2023.

Life Drawing: Working from the Model with Kate Huntington

Description:

In this class, Kate will share her approach to the figure by walking around and giving students one-on-one tips on how to improve their drawings along with ideas to train them to learn how to see better. We'll be dealing with a variety of poses throughout the three-hour period from a half-hour of quick gestures, to a longer pose towards the end. Students are free to work in whatever materials they choose, though Kate does suggest some newsprint or inexpensive paper for the quick poses.

Kate Huntington Bio:

Kate Huntington grew up in Providence, RI, and began painting and drawing in her very early years. In high school, she met an Italian artist named Antonio Dattorro. Though quite eccentric, he was an outstanding teacher, and he gave Kate an understanding of the human form that was unequal to any formal education. She received a scholarship to RISD in 1974 and has worked as a representational painter based in the Providence, RI, metropolitan area continuously since 1976. Painterly Monoprints: Unique Impressions and Experimentation with Kirsten Sorensen

Description:

This class will focus on creating beautiful mixed media monoprints using collage, gel and plexiglass plates, trace drawings, botanicals, and intriguing papers. Our investigation will start with hand printing various textures and patterns on paper to use as collage. These collage creations will be used to enhance the design, composition, color, and personal creative spirit in your larger monoprints. We will use the press and explore the different paints and inks that can be used in monoprints. Our objective is to create a supportive studio atmosphere where artists of all levels can discover a variety of printmaking techniques and create artworks by mixing some traditional processes with experimental perspectives.

Kirsten Sorensen Bio:

Kirsten Sorensen has a BFA in Painting and Art Education. She is an artist and art educator who has taught and directed art-based programs for over 40 years. She spent the last 23 years teaching art at Cranston High School East and lives in Bristol, RI. She currently teaches at Bristol Art Museum and PAC. Kirsten has been concentrating on painting and printmaking, and has exhibited at BAM, PAC, and Art League of Rhode Island.



Drawing in the RISD Museum & Beyond with Frances Middendorf

Wednesdays, 10am – 1pm January 10th – March 13th 10 Weeks \$140 Member || \$295 Non-Member

> RISD Museum Maximum capacity: 15 Intermediate, Advanced, Expert

Description:

Students will meet in the RISD Museum and other museums, studios and institutes in Providence to study artwork by drawing it. Homework will be assigned each week to develop the individual student's own strengths and interests based on the artwork studied. The class will meet on Tuesday afternoons at 4pm for a zoom critique and on Wednesday mornings in the museum. Besides the instructor, art historians, artists and curators will give talks throughout the course. Art history's themes will be the basis for artistic problem solving for each student.

Frances Middendorf Bio:

Frances Middendorf is a painter who teaches drawing at the Rome Art Program in Rome as well as the Providence Art Club. Born in New York, Frances attended the Rhode Island School of Design (BFA), School of Visual Arts, NYC (MFA) and the New York Studio School. She is represented by the Denise Bibro Gallery in New York City. Following a 15-year commercial art career working for clients such as the New York Times, Newsweek, and the Vivian Beaumont Theater at Lincoln Center, Frances Middendorf continued her learning at the New York Studio School. She moved to Italy in 1997 to study with Nicolas Carone and decided to stay. Nicolas Carone (1917-2010) was an articulate describer of the teachings and tenants of Hans Hoffman as well as a friend to many Italian painters, particularly Giorgio Morandi. By emphasizing "plasticity" or the link between surface tension and three dimensionality (Hoffman's push-pull), Carone guided Frances' painting from the narrative to the poetic.



Hand Coloring Photographs with Laurie Klein

Description:

Hand coloring a black and white photograph is an art form all by itself. This hands-on course introduces you to the history, aesthetics, and technical aspects of hand coloring as well as the many techniques for shooting and finishing images printed in the digital era. The all-important last step of preserving and framing the final artwork makes this a comprehensive workshop. Laurie will be showing examples and doing demonstrations throughout the class. All participants will be working on their hand-coloring and will have the opportunity to have numerous one-on-one interactions with Laurie during class time.

Laurie Klein Bio:

Laurie received her MFA in photography from Ohio University and a BFA from the Rochester Institute of Technology (RIT). Laurie studied with Ansel Adams in the mid-1970s. A gifted photographic educator for over 40 years, Laurie teaches classes and presents workshops and photographic tours around the globe.

The soft, passionate style of Laurie's landscapes and portraits in the landscape conveys the depth and richness of the feminine experience and the ethereal beauty of nature. She continued to grow her love affair with the invisible spectrum throughout her commercial, fine art, and wedding photography career. Since Covid, she has been teaching virtual classes on how photographing heals.

She is the author of Hand Coloring Black and White Photography, Photographing the Female Form and the first and second editions of Infrared Photography: Artistic Techniques for Brilliant Images. Her images have appeared in numerous national magazines and galleries.

Drawing For Beginners with Anne Carty

Description:

Do you want to learn how to draw anything and everything in your environment? Basic approaches include creating silhouetted outlines, contour drawings, describing forms using shading and or cross hatching, and implementing the use of shadows. You will build on your skills of describing real objects on paper using simple shapes to convey three dimensional forms. Be prepared to draw with your non dominant hand, in one continuous line, or without glancing at your page at all. All of these and other simple exercises will help you stop overthinking and start illustrating the world you see before you. Drawing utensils include graphite, soft and hard charcoal, and ink. We will touch on concepts of simple perspective, proportion, and various compositional elements to create drawings that are truer to life from interesting vantage points. The goal is to try as many ways as possible to free your hand while learning to draw what you see.

Anne Carty Bio:

Anne Carty has a BFA from the Rhode Island School of Design in Textile Design. She has worked in the Fashion Industry, the Costume Jewelry Industry and as a Decorative painter for homes and businesses. Anne has studied painting with many local artists as well as taking classes at the Art Student's League, the School of Visual Arts, and the National Academy, all in New York City. She has been a member of the PAC for about 13 years. She has studied and works in Watercolors, Oils, Pastel, Acrylics, and Gouache. Anne has taught Jewelry Illustration at the Boston Museum School of Fine Arts. She loves to draw and is excited to be teaching at PAC after serving on the Education Committee for the past 8 years.

Traditional Life/Figure Class with Craig Masten and Kate Huntington

Description:

This class works with a nude model every week, an excellent way to enhance drawing skills for whatever art you do. Each class begins with brief gesture poses to practice how to put natural movement into figures, followed by a long pose to allow more finished work. All levels of experience are welcome, with individual instruction focused on the needs and wants of each participant.

Craig Masten Bio:



Abstract Collage and Letterpress Printing with Vintage Papers with Sarah Short

Description:

We will begin by deconstructing books to create a stash of paper and substrates. You'll transform this paper into collage materials using letterpress printing, gelli plate printing (focusing on typographical prints), and other mixed media techniques. We'll create collages while learning the principles and structures of abstract composition. No prior experience with collage or printmaking is necessary.

Sarah Short Bio:

Sarah Z Short is a mixed-media collage artist from the woods of Rhode Island. Her background as an English teacher explains her love of books, which she also enjoys using as the primary material for her collages. She's inspired by faded book covers, foxing on pages, letterpress printing, and vintage ephemera. Sarah begins by printing with wooden type on pages rescued from discarded books. Her favorite tool is the Nolan Proof Press, which she uses for letterpress printing. The prints are then abstracted in her collage compositions to make the original letter forms unrecognizable. Her interest is in the shapes and white space she can create with the typography. Her collages and prints can be found in galleries and as licensed prints. She has been published in print and online magazines and teaches online and in-person. You can see Sarah's art, read her blog, and learn more about her on her website.



Description:

This class is for those beginners who have always wanted to understand and learn how to create a likeness, render accurate flesh tones, and understand the tools used to venture into the wonderful world of portraiture. We will begin by learning how to draw portraits. To render a proportionally correct image, we need to understand the planes of the head which will be discussed throughout the course. Learning how to draw the portrait first will create a solid foundation before moving onto painting the image. We'll start by painting in black and white and later move towards color. You will have plenty of demos, handouts, and support from the instructor. We will walk through the steps every week to achieve these goals. Appropriate for those who would like a better understanding of how to draw portraits and for those who have never tried portrait oil painting.

Patricia Schneider Bio:

A former fashion illustrator now portrait, stilllife, and figure artist. Grew up taking art classes from Eugene Tonoff from an early age in downtown Providence. Continues her studies weekly at The Academy of Realist Art in Boston. Loves painting the local scene in her hometown of Westport, MA. Taught Drawing Foundations at PAC in 2023.

Description:

Experience the freedom of watercolors! Discover how to live with and enjoy the way water moves your paint. Feel free to expect the unexpected and let it paint for you. You'll learn how to control the flow of watercolor, how much or little water to use to achieve the desired effect, and learn techniques for achieving texture, dramatic lights and darks, luminous grays, translucent color, and "when to stop!" A carefully considered preliminary sketch is the basis of a good painting so we'll check our drawings for composition and correct perspective before we begin to paint.

Susan Klas Wright Bio:

Susan Klas Wright worked as a graphic artist, photographer, and freelance advertising artist in Buffalo, NY. As a fine artist, Susan has exhibited her work at the Kent Art Association and Housatonic Art League in Connecticut, and at the New England Watercolor Society in Plymouth, MA. She also exhibits her work and has been an instructor PAC, Rhode Island Watercolor Society, Wickford Art Association, Jerry's Artarama, and Portsmouth Arts Guild. 

Classic Cinema: Plays into Movies - Tennessee Williams with Paul Stein

Description:

Tennessee Williams was brilliant and prolific, breathing life and passion into such memorable characters as Blanche DuBois and Stanley Kowalski in his critically acclaimed *"A Streetcar Named Desire."* And like them, he was troubled and self-destructive, an abuser of alcohol and drugs. He was awarded four Drama Critic Circle Awards, two Pulitzer Prizes and the Presidential Medal of Freedom. He was derided by critics and blacklisted by Roman Catholic Cardinal Spellman, who condemned one of his scripts as "revolting, deplorable, morally repellent, offensive to Christian standards of decency." He was Tennessee Williams, one of the greatest playwrights in American history. It's not easy to convert a great play into a movie. It's rarely successful, but for many the only way to see these great plays is in movies. Tennessee Williams is unquestionably one of America's greatest playwrights. In this series we will screen five of William's plays that were made into films: *"A Streetcar Named Desire"* with Marlon Brando, Karl Malden, and Vivian Leigh, *"Baby Doll"* with Karl Malden, Carroll Baker, and Eli Wallach, *"The Glass Menagerie"*, with Katherine Hepburn and Sam Waterson, *"Night of the Iguana"* with Ava Gardner, Richard Burton, and Deborah Kerr and *"Cat on a Hot Tin Roof"* with Burl Ives, Paul Newman, and Joann Woodward. A discussion about the play and if it succeeded as a movie will follow each screening. Please Note that movies will not be repeated from the first session in the second session; total of 10 movies will be shown.

Paul Stein Bio:

Paul Stein studied film production at the NYU Graduate School of Film. He has taught film courses at The OLLI @ URI and at the Providence Art Club including Film Appreciation: The Art of Watching Films, Film Noir, The French New Wave, and the films of Jean Renoir, Alfred Hitchcock, Akira Kurosawa, Federico Fellini, and Ingmar Bergman.

Cold Wax and Oil with Jossy Lownes

This class provides experimentation using oil paint, cold wax, and mixed media. The beauty of using cold wax is to create translucency and/or texture through layering. We can add and subtract color and line for unusual designs and compositions. Exercises each week include lots of expressive mark making, adding collage, and making monotype printing as part of the layering process. Through experimentation, the class will find personal ways to express their ideas. We are looking to improve our art works. This will help and provide an enjoyable process.

Jossy Lownes Bio:

Jossy holds degrees from Arizona State University and the University of Illinois. Over her 40-year career, she has trained with many of the art world's most notable talents. She is a past president of the Utah Watercolor Society and the Park City Professional Artists. She is also a past board member of the Kimball Art Center in Park City, Utah, and the Sonoran Arts league in Scottsdale, Az. Juried shows include the Wickford Art Festival (3 years), Utah Arts Festival (5 years), and Celebration of Fine Art in Scottsdale (16 years). Gallery representation is currently with Five Main Gallery in Wickford, Complements Art in North Smithfield, RI, and The Art Department, Scottsdale, AZ. Description:

In this course we will be using a spot-lit model whose stance and poses will be timed and varied, the model will be dressed in a swimsuit or workout wear for the short-timed poses and draping and using a variety of clothing worn by the model for the longer-timed poses.

Karen Murtha Bio:

A Rhode Island School of Design graduate and artist member of the Providence Art Club. Karen is primarily a figurative painter. Inspired, when young, by the beautiful paintings in her grandmother's family home, she began to paint, working in the classical tradition to capture the light, architecture, and the human figure. She is especially fascinated by the little vignettes of people in all kinds of situations, finding the positions, gestures, and movement, the true expression of a person, and the way they relate to one another. Within those interactions, relationships, and the surroundings, a unique story is conveyed. In the quest to achieve authenticity, a personal expression was created of that beautiful illusion of the

moment. Oil paints are most frequently used as her medium with a limited palette of 3 primary colors plus white. Her application is used on canvas, linen, and wood. She also enjoys the freedom of working in watercolor on Yupo, finding it a fun application of paint. Karen formally taught as an art teacher in the East Greenwich School system and at The Newport Art Museum's, Coleman Center. She currently teaches at PAC, The Wickford Art Association, and The Warwick Center for the Arts. She also has illustrated for many companies, which included greeting cards and paper products, and countless wall murals for both businesses and private clients.

Description:

Acrylic fine art painting has been growing in popularity for decades. The medium offers some distinct benefits for some artists, especially for beginners. This course is for painters of any experience level or genre, whether you are new to acrylics, or want to reacquaint yourself. The vast majority of what's covered in this course are the same principles offered in oil and watercolor classes, composition, values, color, light, paint mixing, and more. There is a great deal of individual attention in this class, so the pace is geared separately for each student. Tom Monahan was an oil painter who moved primarily to acrylics about six years ago and believes there is virtually nothing that can be done with oil that can't be done in acrylics, just done differently sometimes.

Tom Monahan Bio:

Tom Monahan has been an Exhibiting Artist member of the Providence Art Club since 2014. He is mostly a representational artist working in oil, acrylic, gouache, and mixed media. Tom's art has been honored in exhibits both regionally and nationally. His paintings hang in private collections from Seattle to Miami, LA to Normandy. Tom has been teaching at PAC since 2018. He's served the Club in many volunteer capacities from the Board to Marketing Committee chair, to serving as Chair of the House Committee presently. In his professional life Tom was one of the leading Creative Directors in advertising and a world-renowned Creativity Expert.
