Nominating Committee Report

The Nominating Committee, working under the auspices of the Governance Committee, met through the fall and early winter to identify and interview candidates to be elected to the PAC Board of Managers in 2025. The Committee first clarified its roles and responsibilities, reviewed the expertise and talent currently on the BOM and those needed to be replaced or added when filling the open positions, and accordingly established criteria for the new nominations. Working together, the Committee reached out to 45 members to discuss service on the BOM, and interviewed 15 final candidates. In the process, several candidates were encouraged to become more engaged in Club activities through working Committees and other volunteer opportunities. This process of engagement will be ongoing in the coming year and all members interested in either recommending candidates, joining committees, or self-nominating should contact the Nominating Committee co-chairs.
